Halloween

⁵ My sister Vanessa loves monsters! She always dressed up as a ghost or wore a monster costume of some kind. One year she was Dracula for Halloween, and another time, she was Voldemort. She was really scary! Every Halloween, we walked from house to house trick-or-treating. When we got home, we would sit at the kitchen table and eat our candy until we had stomachaches.

¹⁰ One Halloween when Vanessa was thirteen, and I was eleven, I asked: "What time are we going trick-or-treating tonight?"

"I have a secret, Lily," she said. I'm not going trick-or-treating tonight. My friend Sarah is throwing a Halloween party, and I'm going to it".

Sarah was Vanessa's friend, who lived two streets away. I was really

¹⁵ disappointed that I wasn't invited. Then Vanessa said, "Why don't you come with me?"

"Really? Can I?"

"Of course, but you can't tell Mom and Dad, OK!"

"OK. I promise." I was so excited! The year before, a Halloween party took

²⁰ place at the school's gymnasium, and it was so much fun. We carved pumpkins, wore costumes, and ate candy. They even had a small haunted house. I couldn't wait for Sarah's party!

I dressed up as a big frog, and my sister wore a werewolf costume. We left the house to go to Sarah's, but I soon realized that we weren't walking to Sarah's

²⁵ house. We were walking into the forest, which was dark and scary at night.

As we walked into it, I got really scared. I could see a light in the middle of the clearing. Sarah was sitting at a bonfire drinking hot cocoa. When we sat down, she gave us each a cup as well.

"Are you ready to see the ghost?" Sarah asked.



³⁰ “The ghost? What ghost?”

“The ghost of Sam Smith!” she said.

Everyone in our town knew about the legend of Sam Smith. He was a thief who lost a bet with the devil in the late 1800s. Now his ghost arrived every October 31st with a candle in a carved-out pumpkin to find his way home. I
